



EMERGING ECONOMIES COOPERATION: A WORKING DOCUMENT FOR BUSINESS FACILIATION AND ENGAGEMENT BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA AND THE REPUBLIC OF KENYA

- 1. Hon. Moses Kiarie Kuria, Cabinet Secretary for Trade, Industry and Investment of the Republic of Kenya, visited Indonesia between 8th and 11th May 2023, for official and business engagements, on invitation of the Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment of the Republic of Indonesia, Hon. Luhut Binsar Panjaitan.
- 2. The visit was a follow up on outcomes of bilateral talks between H.E. Dr. William Samoei Ruto, CGH, President of the Republic of Kenya, and Hon. Luhut Binsar Pandajaitan, Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment of the Republic of Indonesia, held on Friday 20th January 2023. During the meeting at State House Nairobi, the two sides agreed to form a Joint Task Force, supported by the Council of Economic Advisors to the President for strategy, and immediately commence detailed discussions on cooperation and collaboration in the following three sectors:
 - i) Trade, investment and industry:- To be convened on the Kenyan side by the Cabinet Secretary for Trade, Investment and Industry and to include trade, agriculture, mining, pharmaceuticals, infrastructure and port operations,
 - ii) Energy, Petroleum and Mining:- To be convened by the Kenyan Cabinet Secretary for Energy and Petroleum,
 - iii) Defense and Strategic Industry:- To be convened on the Kenyan side by the Kenyan Cabinet Secretary for Defense,
- 3. During the three-day engagements, held under the guidance of the Office of the Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment, the

Cabinet Secretary together with members of his delegation, held focused consultative sessions with key players from the Indonesian State Owned Enterprises, select private sector players, Indonesian state agencies that facilitate Trade and Investment; and conducted a tour of Indonesian Ports Authority (PELINDO) and held a roundtable discussion with the Federation of Indonesian Chamber of Commerce (KADIN).

4. The Coordinating Minister and Cabinet Secretary thereby agreed that Kenya and Indonesia endeavor to upscale further engagements in the following sectoral areas with immediate effect:
